# **Neighbourhood Development Plan**

### CONSULTATION

## Dear Parishioner,

Allerthorpe Parish Council has recently started the process of preparing a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) for our parish (see map). NDPs have emerged from the Localism Act of 2012 which gave Parish and Town Council the powers to prepare a plan which gives local communities a very powerful voice in deciding on the scale, type and nature of what development takes place in their area.

NDPs will have legal status and, when adopted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council, will have to be taken into account before any development takes place. We want our NDP to be based on a shared vision of what we want our village and parish to look like in 15 to 25 years' time, in terms of housing, green spaces, community facilities etc.

Control of the Contro

Our NDP will be expected to fit with the East Riding Local Plan. The East Riding Local Plan is the planning framework for the East Riding for the next 15 years and is expected to be adopted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council later this year. Once adopted, it will form part of the development plan used by East Riding Council to determine planning applications. In the emerging Local Plan, Allerthorpe is classed as a 'Village'. New houses, usually comprising a single dwelling, will be supported where they do not detract from the character and appearance of the Village. The emerging East Riding Local Plan does not allocate specific pieces of land for development in Allerthorpe.

Our NDP will include local planning policies for the use and development of land in our parish. It will include a vision and add local detail to the policies in the emerging East Riding Local Plan. Neighbourhood Plans cannot be used to prevent development from taking place but can promote more development than is set out in the East Riding Local Plan and shape the development coming forward, should this be what the community want. Local people can not only write their own Neighbourhood Plans but they also decide whether the plan should be adopted through a local referendum vote.

This is the first time parishes such as ours have been given the chance to play such a leading role in deciding the kind of place we want to live in. In order to create this shared version, we really need you, and as many people as possible from the parish, to fill in this questionnaire, and let us have your views.
