Parish Council Meeting: The next meetings of the Parish Council will be on Monday 25th July 2016 and Monday 26th Sept at 8:00pm in the Village Hall.

Members of the Public & Press are welcome at meetings of Allerthorpe Parish Council. Public Participation will commence prior to the start of the full council meeting when members of the public can raise questions or make statements to the Parish Council about any issues they may have. Because we are restricted to only 10 minutes, the public are encouraged to use this facility as an opportunity to raise issues rather than to seek resolution and in most cases the council will need to make referrals before being able to provide researched answers.

Internet Survey: We again thank everyone who partook in the online survey of Internet Service in the Parish and although the sample size was relatively small at 23%, it still gives us a very good picture of the service being delivered on the back of the governments attempts to improve rural services. It is clear that there is a huge disconnect between what the government is promising and what BT (the infrastructure owner) are delivering. There are still 61% of residents who responded that are achieving <3mbs most of the day and only 4 residents achieving 9-14mbs. We have had further discussions with Insp York of Humberside Police and she has committed to increasing the resources where possible and we have again pressed the ERYC for a more regular return of the portable speed sign.
